## LETTER FROM PASTOR REBECCA

Dear Friends,

There is something powerful when we are able to not only read the stories of the Bible, but are able to find ourselves in the story. It is then that it becomes *our* story. I find that to be true as we live in this time of Easter, the ascension of Jesus, and Pentecost.

It is not surprising that the disciples are overjoyed to see Jesus again and spend more time with him. There had been such sadness in his death, not only in recognition of their mistakes, but because it felt like their time with Jesus was cut short. They had such fond memories of times they had spent with Jesus, and they wanted more time.

In these last two months we can certainly understand those emotions, and all of the reflecting that the disciples must have been doing. I know it is certainly true for me. It is amazing to think back on all of the moments that I have shared with you in these last ten years: recreating the last supper and Jesus praying in the garden, the gift of special music offered by choirs and individuals, sharing the gift of dance, powerful discussions in study groups, the development of Our Kids and monthly ministry at the Appleton Warming Shelter, mission trips, being invited into your lives as you grieved the loss of someone, or being able to hold your child and declare to all "this child is a child of God". Indeed, it is hard to name all of the memories that keep resurfacing, and I thank you for sharing those times with me. I have grown in so many ways as I have served with you in ministry; taking risks and trying new things, being challenged to think theologically about different issues, or in witnessing your ministry. Even after 10 years there are ways in which it feels the time is too short, that there is more I would enjoy doing and sharing with you.

Only as we read in *our* story there came a time when Jesus departed, and he directed the attention of the disciples to the places they were to go as witnesses. Their work was not done, but it would be different. The same is true for us. In a few weeks we will part and go in different directions, each called to continue our ministry of being Christ's witnesses in Black Creek, Seymour, and Neenah. It will be hard, and at times hard to imagine how things will be. Change is always hard, but the good news is we will not be facing it alone.

We will have our friendship as we hold one another in prayer, and most importantly we will have the help of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit came and breathed new life, new passion and energy into the disciples for the work they were called to do. I trust the same will be true for each of us. All of you have such wonderful gifts to offer, and Pastor Mark will open you to new experiences of the Spirit. Pastor Mark will bring new energy and ideas that will inspire and nurture you in your new life together.

When we stay open to the Holy Spirit, and the changes that often come as God works, we experience amazing things. That has certainly been true of my experience in this community. Thank you for sharing this journey with me, and allowing me to serve as your pastor. While I will no longer be serving as your pastor, and therefore no longer sharing in your lives by conducting funerals, weddings, or funerals, I will continue to hold you in my heart and prayers, praying that you will continue to know for yourselves the amazing things God does.

## "A CHANCE TO DANCE"

**Joint Worship Service · Sunday, June 11 · 10 AM at City Site**

United Methodist Pastor Rich Rubietta, from Park Ridge, Illinois, will lead a special Musical service of worship on June 11 as we bid farewell to the Henry family and celebrate our ministry together. Rubietta is a songwriter and worship consultant who conducts high-energy, interactive worship experiences which include audience participation and upbeat versions of familiar Hymns and original material.



A graduate of Northwestern University with a degree in Music and an Illinois Arts Council ArtsTour artist, Rubietta has been offering new styles to traditional Church Hymns and songs. "I'm finding that folks in the church of all ages and all denominations are yearning to sing their faith using music that moves them on a deeper emotional and spiritual level," he says. "My goal is give everyone freedom to try new things or not, without any pressure. As long as the local musicians and I can facilitate an experience that helps people feel God's presence, then it's mission accomplished!"

A second offering will be taken at this worship service to support Pastor Rubietta. The ministry he offers is not a staff position with salary or benefits, but rather funded by the support of local congregations he visits. Any gifts offered will not only help to cover the costs of transportation, but also to help sustain his ministry.

## ARE WE UP FOR THE CHALLENGE?

Jesus came to teach and invite us into a deeper relationship with God. Sometimes it did indeed feel more like a challenge though. We see how true this is in Luke 18:18-25, when a rich man walks away, unable or unwilling, to sell all he has and give it to the poor. This year we as a congregation are facing a similar challenge in our commitment to Christ and the ministries of his church.

A member of the congregation is challenging us as a church to grow in our financial contributions to the general budget of the church. For every dollar that we give that exceeds last year's giving, we will receive a matching gift from this member of up to \$10,000! That means that if we as a church are able to give \$150,000 towards the general budget by the end of December, an additional gift of \$10,000 will be given, reaching a total of \$160,000 for the general budget. Each member and friend of the church is invited to consider how they might share in this challenge. Perhaps it is with an additional one-time gift. Maybe it easiest for someone to add a little bit each week to their giving. How can you share in this challenge, and at the same time find yourself deepening your relationship with God? Are we as a church able to receive this challenge, or will we, like the rich man, walk away?

## TIME FOR RENEWAL

In the very beginning we learn the value of rest, for on the seventh day God rested. The importance for taking time to rest, to reflect, to reconnect is reiterated throughout scripture, whether it be in laws written in the Old Testament, or even Jesus' own practice. It is one of the reasons that clergy receive a Sabbath day during the week knowing that work is being done on Sunday. Only sometimes more intentional, more significant time is needed beyond a weekly Sabbath day. That is why Foundations like the Lily Foundation or our own Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation offer assistance for clergy to take renewal leaves, or why the Wisconsin Annual Conference offers clergy the opportunity to take a renewal leave every 7 years. A renewal leave isn't a vacation. It is time for a clergyperson to step away from the daily demands of the parish to rest, to reconnect with family, friends, and God, to read and study, and to reflect on their calling.

In the past two years Pastor Rebecca began to recognize her need for a renewal leave to recharge her energy and creativity for local church ministry. She has been in numerous conversations with the Staff Parish Relations Committee and with the cabinet to plan this time away for three months during the summer. It was decided and approved that Pastor Rebecca would take three months in 2017 for renewal. In addition, the Wisconsin United Methodist Foundation offered a grant to defray the additional costs that the congregation may incur in finding coverage for pastoral care and worship leadership. Since this decision, Pastor Rebecca's appointment to Neenah Menasha First UMC has been announced. The appointment, however, was made with the understanding that Pastor Rebecca would still be able to take her renewal leave.

What does this mean for New Life UMC? It means that Pastor Rebecca will be finishing her ministry here earlier in June so that she can begin her renewal leave. It also means the financial funds from the Wisconsin UM Foundation will be shared between New Life UMC and Neenah Menasha First UMC (who will support Pastor Rebecca for the remaining 2 months of her renewal leave). In planning for the renewal leave Pastor Rebecca and the SPRC determined worship leadership would be offered by lay speakers within our local church, and that a clergyperson would be named to be on-call for pastoral care. While we at New Life UMC will not be seeing and experiencing the

fruits of Pastor Rebecca's leave, we know that we are contributing to the well-being of the church as we care for one of its leaders. If you have any questions you may talk with Pastor Rebecca.


